To be eligible for this grant, farms must:

- 1. Be located in Vermont and in business for a minimum of one year;
- 2. Be able to complete the project by December 31, 2026;
- 3. Not have received a Vermont Family Farmer of the Month award two years prior to submitting the application;
- 4. Hold an active NOFA-VT Membership at any level, including our \$1/year Community Tier.
